

### Gamston with West Drayton and Eaton Parish Council

Notes from the meeting held on Thursday 12th January 2023 at Gamston School.

### Meeting

The meeting began with the usual formalities and the minutes from the previous meeting were agreed as being correct.

### Highways

District and County Councillor Ogle attended the meeting but was unable to offer any updates on outstanding issues in the Parish. He was asked how best to escalate issues which the Parish Council are not getting responses for and said that individual complaints are taken seriously and that so long as things are recorded, everything will get dealt with eventually. He explained however, that the Council might want to send any outstanding issues to the Complaints Department at Notts County Council. The Clerk will write to the Complaints Department to complain and ask for further advice on the service level agreements for response times to emails and times it takes Via Ltd to action the matters raised.

Members of the public are advised to report any new Highways issues (faulty street lights/overgrown hedges & trees/ pavement, road & drainage issues etc.) in the first instance, through the 'My Notts' app or online at <a href="https://www.Nottinghamshire.gov.uk">www.Nottinghamshire.gov.uk</a>

If no action is taken then they should then bring it to the Parish Council meeting for escalation.

Likewise, any District Council issues (Fly tipping/ broken or missing street nameplates/ dog fouling etc.) should be reported to Bassetlaw District Council at www.bassetlaw.gov.uk If no action is taken then it should again be brought to the Parish Council meeting for escalation.

### **Finance**

Payments were approved and a discussion was held regarding a grant request from the Idle Times. The previous contribution of £330 has remained the same for many years and the magazine which is produced and delivered by volunteers, has escalating costs. The Parish Council want to support the Idle Times as it is an essential method of communication within the parishes and it was decided that a contribution of £400 would be made for this year.

The 2023/2024 budget was approved and it was agreed that it would be necessary to increase the precept in order to meet the required amount. This has not been raised for well over a decade and is far behind inflation. In order to determine the increase required, the members used guidance from the National Association of Local Councils. They also studied the

National average band D precept amounts for Parish Councils, the Bassetlaw local Parish Council amounts and data regards the precept at Gamston for the past 20 years. Inflation was also taken into account. As a result, a decision was made to increase the precept to £13,896 (£4.66 per month for a Band D property), which is still well below the national average. This is an actual increase of £2.47 per month for a Band D property. In return for this, the Parish Council is planning to make a transformational change by way of improvements within the villages that will be visible to all. One of which is joining the Notts County Council Lengthsman scheme, which allows for the Lengthsman to undertake various tasks around the Parishes and thereby improving the appearance of the five villages for the benefit of the community.

### **Planning**

• 22/01633/OUT Land to the South of Ordsall, Ollerton Rd, Ordsall, Retford.

Outline application with some matters reserved (approval being sought for access) for residential development, a local centre, school, community hub, sports pitches, extra care facility, community park, landscaping, supporting infrastructure and means of access.

Due to the impact and problems this would cause in our Parish, predominantly it would exacerbate the ongoing highways issues through Eaton, the council strongly objected to this application.

### The Lengthsman Scheme

The Lengthsman will start on the 1st February and will work 6 hours per week across the villages. The council members discussed which tasks would be required in each village and which will take priority. Expect more news on this role in the future.

# NOTES FROM THE ELKESLEY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING ON 17th JANUARY 2023

Councillor Skelton chaired the meeting & started off by welcoming everyone present & then gave his monthly report. He told members that PC Gareth Mitchell is back on duty. The speeding, nuisance drivers & overweight vehicles operations are still ongoing. Councillors again donated 29 hours of their own time to village work during the month on various tasks. He also gave thanks to the Clerk, Wendy Davies, for all the work she does behind the scenes.

During the public session the following items were raised:

The Chairman of the Memorial Hall told the Council that they were holding open meeting on 25 January with the villagers to ask what requirements they would like for the upcoming Coronation festivities

There are still vacancies for Trustees. If anyone is interested, please contact the Memorial Hall.

The bar is now in use and can be used for private parties.

It would be nice to be able to use it as a 'village pub' occasionally, but more helpers are needed for this to take place.

It is hoped to hold a Jazz evening during the Summer.

Councillor Kevin Dukes has been in contact with a villager regarding the quad bike issue in the woods. This is really a County Council issue, but he is happy liaise with the County Councillor, Nigel Turner, to see if things can be done to stop it. The state of the river was also mentioned along with the flooding in the wood. The Environment Agency are working with Bassetlaw regarding flooding in the area to try and alleviate it.

The Bassetlaw District Local Plan public consultation is still ongoing. Kevin also said he was standing down as the District Council in May having been the Councillor for 8 years. Kevin still stays as Chairman of the Bassetlaw Foodbank for another couple of years. The Chairman and members thanked him for all his hard work & wished him well for the future.

An alternative to having a real Christmas tree was discussed. It was agreed that it would be better for the environment & it would reduced the yearly cost significantly if the Parish Council purchased one similar to that at Van Dykes Hotel. It will pay for itself in the first year allowing the Council in subsequent years to purchase other decorations for other parts of the village. This is going to be purchased now whilst on special offer. Tuxford Young Farmers are to be contacted & asked to remove this year's tree from near the shop.

The budget for 2023 – 24 was discussed. An increase of 6% was agreed. This amounts to an increase of 33p per month based on Band D. £3.91 per year.

An updated planning application for Manor Farm was discussed. There are 2 plots. On one where the house is, the other where the proposal is for 4 properties and 4 garages. After discussion it was decided that the Parish Council should make observations regarding the location of the garages and the mature trees on site. It was also felt that with the cost of living crisis perhaps as part of the planning procedure solar panels should be a consideration.



# **Voter ID: A summary**

On **Thursday 4 May 2023**, local elections are taking place across 230 councils in England.

At these elections, you will need to bring photo ID to be able to vote at a polling station. A wide range of photo ID will be accepted, including passports, driving licences and cards with a PASS Mark.

If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document known as a Voter Authority Certificate. Visit **electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID**, call **0800 328 0280**, or scan the QR code below to find out more, including:

- Whether elections are taking place in your area in May
- The full list of accepted forms of photo ID
- How to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate (if you need one)
- What will happen at the polling station


