Gamston with West Drayton and Eaton Parish Council

Notes from the meeting held on Wednesday 14th December 2022 at Gamston School.

The Five Villages Trust

The lease transfer from the Southwell Diocesan Board of Finance to Multi Acadamy Trust is in the hands of the solicitor and following minor changes should be complete by February. A discussion was held about the remit of The Five Villages Trust and the difference between the Managing Trustees and the Committee of Management.

The Dual Use Agreement was updated and changes were agreed in respect of the role of the Management Committee.

Highways

District and County Councillor Ogle did not attend the meeting and no update was received on matters outstanding.

West Drayton - The grips have now been completed.

The Clerk has chased up the road resurfacing issue but there has been no response from the Highways Manager.

<u>Rockley</u> – The leaning lamp post on the A638 opposite Holme Lane has been inspected and is awaiting repair, however the Inspector has said there is no danger and it is safe in it's current condition. The Clerk will chase up again for a date for repair.

Finance

Payments were approved and a discussion was held regarding a grant request from the Idle Times. The amount will be agreed at the next meeting.

The future provision of Christmas trees in the villages was discussed, as Rockley residents would like a tree. They had offered to purchase and decorate a tree but Nottinghamshire County Council would not allow them to display it, stating that the insurance would be too expensive. In the future, this could be covered by the Parish Council's insurance.

Nottinghamshire County Council also dictate around the planting of trees and so the tree would have to be ornamental only and could not be planted.

Pride in the Parishes

The funding of Pride in the Parishes was discussed and whilst it was decided that this is a very good idea and a way of bringing the community together, it would be very expensive to hold such an event. Bassetlaw District Council have an Achievers Award Ceremony and nominations can be made through them. Alternatively, a more local event could be held in conjunction with another event.

Notes from the Meeting of the Elkesley Parish Council 20th December 22

The Chair started the meeting to say that it is with great sadness that the village has lost another great character Geoff Savill. During his time as a Parish Councillor for many years and then a volunteer; Geoff has done so much to shape and build our community; he was no stranger to getting stuck in to help with our projects, repairs and maintenance. A minutes silence then took place.

The Parish Council approved to install two benches for walkers to use; one on Sandy Lane and the other in the Brough Lane area.

The Councillors spent time discussing ideas for the Parish Council working with and supporting other village groups to carry out a variety of events in the village.

The Chair proposed to consider having a purpose built Christmas tree; a resident has offered to fabricate a Christmas tree structure made in sections and easy to assemble. In the long term, this would be a great saving and last for many years. It was agreed to look into the costing for this and report back at the next meeting.

The Council then went through the draft budget figures ready for the setting of the precept in January.

No objections were made against the planning application for application reference 22/01566/HSE - 73 Lawnwood Ave — Proposed porch with WC to be constructed with traditional masonry walls and render finish to match existing.

Bassetlaw District Council has identified Elkesley as a potential area that they would like to engage with on the current and upcoming schemes (funding currently up to 2025) to help with energy efficiency. They are working on domestic energy efficiency retrofit for the private housing sector, particularly focusing on low income and low EPC households. Additionally, there is a portion specifically ring fenced for off-gas properties. Leaflets have been distributed; if you haven't received one then try the internet for *Green Grants Phase 3 Nottinghamshire*. A representative from the District Council will be attending a parish council meeting after Christmas to discuss this further; residents are invited to attend if they wish.

The Mobile Community shop will not be visiting Elkesley after the 19th December. Since it's launch in September, they have just had 7 residents sign up to be members and for the last couple of weeks they have had no one visit the shop. Compared to the other locations they visit these numbers are very small. They have reviewed usage of the facility and have decided to re site the unit to another village in the New Year to see if there is a better up take of the facility.

On the 4th May 2023, the Parish elections will be taking place. If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor; the District Council will be producing a guide which will be circulated in the New Year.

Finally, the Parish Council wishes you all a Happy New Year.


