



Gamston with West Drayton and Eaton Parish Council

Notes from the meeting held on Thursday 16th November 2023 at Gamston School.

The meeting began with the usual formalities and the minutes from the previous meeting were agreed as being correct.

There were three members of the public present who all shared their concerns about the recent flooding, un-repaired damage to roads and planning issues.

District Council matters

District Councillor Dinsdale did not attend the meeting but sent his apologies. The clerk is to request that Councillor Dinsdale provides a written update in the future if unable to attend meetings.

Anti Social behavior in Eaton

We are still awaiting an update from Bassetlaw District Council Anti Social Behaviour Team in order to reach a long-term solution. The Clerk will chase this up again both with BDC and District Councilor Dinsdale.

Any District Council issues (Fly tipping/ broken or missing street nameplates/ dog fouling etc.) should be reported to Bassetlaw District Council at *www.bassetlaw.gov.uk*

If no action is taken then it should be brought to the attention of the Parish Council for escalation.

County Council and Highways matters

County Councillor John Ogle was not present at the meeting and did not send an update.

Rectory Lane adjacent to Severn Trent Sewage Works, Gamston – overgrown hedges and trees are making the pavement difficult to use.

The overgrown hedges and trees have now been cut back.

Muttonshire Hill, Gamston – Request to extend the 40mph out of the village.

It has now been agreed that the 40 mph speed limits will be extended out to prior to the entrance to Gamston airfield and will include the required repeaters closer to the village. Although there is no time scale for this, it is now on the Schedule of Works.

Still awaiting quotes and risk assessments.

Footpath safety

The Parish Council have proposed that the public right of way leading from West Drayton village to the A1 should be closed due to the safety concerns of pedestrians on the A1. This proposal will be forwarded to the Countryside Access Manager.

Church Lane and Old London road near Eel Pie Farm, West Drayton - road repairs

This has been reported on numerous occasions and the recent flooding has exasperated the conditions. Whilst the County Council has previously stated that there are no funds available to carry out this work, the Parish Council believe that this is now a matter of Health and Safety. There is no footpath and residents, dog walkers; elderly and unsteady residents from the care home, ramblers and people attending church have to negotiate the deep potholes on Church Lane. The Clerk will send an email to Highways highlighting these concerns.

Streetlight at Woodyard Lane, Eaton

The streetlight has still not been repaired and the Parish Council believes this is a safety issue due to the dark nights and a trip hazard for residents due to the state of the road. The clerk will email both Highways and County Councillor Ogle to progress this.

Bus shelter repair, Eaton

The bus shelter has now been repaired.

At the previous meeting, CC Ogle stated that he is keen to get the white lines repainted at the entrances to the villages as many of them have worn away and some funds are available. The clerk will send a list of relevant locations.

Members of the public are advised to report any new Highways issues (faulty street lights/ overgrown hedges & trees/ pavement, road & drainage issues etc.) in the first instance, through the 'My Notts' app or online at *www.Nottinghamshire.gov.uk*

If no action is taken then they should then bring it to the attention of the Parish Council for escalation.

Community Speedwatch

PCSO Dale has still not carried out any risk assessments in the villages in our parish to ascertain suitable locations where the speed camera could be used. The Clerk will chase this up again. Due to the cost implications of purchasing the equipment and the lack of investment by the Police, the Parish Council are now considering whether or not this is actually a viable option.

Flooding

The effects in each village were discussed and the predominant question was why did it happen? The clerk is to request information from the relevant agencies regarding what happened and their response to the disaster. Each village had a different experience with the agencies. None of the residents received the Government flood alert. Overall, Councillors felt let down as a community and want to safeguard residents and properties in the future. The Parish Council would like to be involved in helping the agencies make the correct decisions for our area so that we could be more prepared to deal with any future issues. The flood plan that was created a few years ago will be revisited and updated and a flood assist kit will be researched. The Clerk will look into the Flood Warden Scheme.

Last week's Elkesley Parish Council meeting was held at the new time of 6pm on Wednesday 15th November 23. It had been decided that our Council meetings will be trialled at the earlier time of 6pm in an effort to maximise work life balance and to try and include more members of the community. The decision has been made during this meeting to continue this new time table which appears to be running well.

Our thoughts are again with Councillor Mick Stronach who remains in a stable condition and has been discharged back home after suddenly falling unwell several weeks ago. We send our best wishes to Cllr Stronach and wish him a speedy recovery.

Once again partnership working has remained key, with issues continually being addressed such as criminality, anti-social behaviour and anti-social driving, PC Steve Pridmore has become the new local Beat Manager; the aim of the Council is to work alongside PC Pridmore in order to maximise public safety and reduce crime and ant-social behaviour. A National week of Police action has seen varying departments tackle driving this week locally, and this will continue in order to maximise road safety.

Please report any incidents of Crime, Anti-Social Behaviour, Anti-Social Driving or other illegal activity or incidents to Crimestoppers anonymously on **0800555111**, or report incidents directly to the Police on **101**, or in an emergency or if life or property are at risk call **999**.

Another reminder that the date is set for the Christingle and Christmas lights turn on, Sunday 3rd December 23. The Christingle will commence at 4pm at the Church, followed by the Christmas lights switch on and festivities at the Village Hall at 5pm, where the bar will be open, various stalls, stands and items on sale and display we will in place and food will be served by the amazing "MEAT CASTLES" who serve home made burgers, fries etc, definately one to save for your diaries! Elkesley Parish Councillors have again donated many hours this month, much of which is spent on administrative duties due to Highways faults, issues around Criminality, Anti-Social Bahaviour, Theft and Vandalism over recent months and neighbourhood and event planning. Also the checks on the park and play equipment, checks on our village defibrillators which are in the bus stop near the church and at the shop, and other tasks such as work on the Churchyard and Cemetery.

Now the colder weather has arrived its noticeable that several street lights are out which have been reported, some already repaired. It appears that the bridge over the A1 on Elkesley Bridge Road is also developing a ridge once again and this will be closely monitored and reported for any required remedial works to be decided or conducted.

Do you know there is a "MY NOTTS APP" which is available on Android and Apple devices and allows you to report faults directly and quickly to Notts County Council? Download the app and get reporting faults today!

HUG2 still remains the focus of Bassetlaw Council who aim to support as many as possible with green energy grants for Air Source Heating, Solar Panels, Cavity Wall Insulation, UPVC upgrades and much more! The requirements are that the property does not currently benefit from gas central heating and has an EPG of 4 or below.

If you meet the criteria and could benefit from loft and cavity wall insulation, UPVC upgrades, solar and batteries, air source heating and other areas, then you may be eligible and may be entitled to this assistance.

Get in touch with Bassetlaw District Council if you think you could benefit or if require further information.

Some properties in the village have already benefited and are up and running with Air Source and Solar, so it's worth an enquiry, you too could benefit!




