

#### Gamston with West Drayton and Eaton Parish Council

Notes from the meeting held on Thursday 13th July 2023 at Gamston School.

The meeting began with the usual formalities and the minutes from the previous meeting were agreed as being correct.

#### Antisocial behaviour in Eaton

The Commercial Manager at Bassetlaw District Council is to inspect a second potential site for a CCTV camera and the Anti Social Behaviour Team are trying to arrange a meeting with PC Marsh.

#### **Update on the Community Speedwatch Programme**

PCSO Dale is to carry out an assessment on all the villages in our parish to ascertain suitable locations where the speed camera could be used.

#### Notts bus on demand

A review is to take place in the future regarding new areas the bus could cover. The Clerk is to question when this review is likely and also ask again, why, when the bus already drives through Gamston and Eaton it will not pick up or drop off in either village.

#### **Sharp bins**

A reply has been received from the Environmental Services Manager through District Councillor Dinsdale stating that Sharps bins should be collected from the front door within the property boundary and not be left in a public place. Councillor Moakes stated that the online website contradicts this and it is still unclear.

#### **District Council matters**

District Councilor Dinsdale did not attend the meeting and there were no outstanding matters to raise.

Any District Council issues (Fly tipping/ broken or missing street nameplates/ dog fouling etc.) should be reported to Bassetlaw District Council at <a href="https://www.bassetlaw.gov.uk">www.bassetlaw.gov.uk</a>
If no action is taken then it should be brought to the attention of the Parish Council for escalation

#### Highways

County Councillor John Ogle was in attendance and the Chairman congratulated him on becoming Chair of Nottinghamshire County Council. County Councillor Ogle stated that Highways Drainage now has a budget of £850,000, but that it will take six years to carry out all the necessary repairs and that the A638 at Eaton is a priority.

The following areas were then discussed:

#### **EATON**

Feasibility study and the response from VIA

Whilst some progress has been made, the Parish Council are still not satisfied with the results of the feasibility study and feel that traffic calming in the actual village has not been dealt with and that the response does not give enough detail as to why measures will not be taken. As the study was carried out in 2020 during lockdown, it was agreed that the figures for vehicles speeding through the village are incorrect and in order to reflect reality, a further study should take place.

County Councillor Ogle confirmed that Eaton is now a safety priority and that the entrance to Eaton from the Ordsall side will have the required work carried out when money becomes available. He suggested that the Parish Council email the Highways Officer for our area and ask when the promised work will be delivered.

#### **GAMSTON**

Rectory Lane adjacent to Severn Trent Sewage Works – overgrown hedges and trees are making the pavement difficult to use.

Work has still not been carried out and there is to be a re-inspection. CC Ogle requested that an email be sent to both himself and Highways to forward the issue.

Muttonshire Hill – Request to extend the 40mph out of the village.

County Councillor Ogle stated that this will not happen, although we have not been informed by Highways. The Clerk will email Highways requesting why this will not be carried out.

#### ROCKLEY

Overgrown footpaths on the A638 between Rockley and Markham Moor.

Residents have raised the issue that the footpath is very overgrown and un-useable. The Clerk will email Highways asking for it to be cleared.

#### **WEST DRAYTON**

Overgrown hedges on Church Lane

As this is private land, the Clerk will write to the owners requesting that the hedges be cut back as they are obscuring the view of the junction.

Members of the public are advised to report any new Highways issues (faulty street lights/ overgrown hedges & trees/ pavement, road & drainage issues etc.) in the first instance, through the 'My Notts' app or online at www.Nottinghamshire.gov.uk

If no action is taken then they should then bring it to the attention of the Parish Council for escalation

#### **Mosquitoes in Gamston**

Following two years without a problem, the mosquitoes are back in Gamston. Councillor Worthington read an update from Environmental Health at BDC, which said that whilst they have sprayed again this year, they are unable to access some of the problem area due to overgrown vegetation. They are monitoring the situation and will spray again if necessary. Local residents have arranged a meeting on Sunday 23rd July at St Peters Church, Gamston to discuss this problem.

#### Village signs

Councillor Ramsden has been approached by residents of Rockley requesting the possibility of village signs being placed at the entrances to the village. Whilst this is very appealing and would be supported by the Parish Council, unfortunately it would be very expensive to erect signs at the entrances to all five villages (requiring 15 signs in total). The cost for even one sign per village would be over £30,000 & this is just not possible from Parish Council funds. It was suggested that the residents could look into fund raising schemes in order to progress with this.

#### Neighbourhood Watch Alerts 21 million scam emails reported







Almost 21 million reports have been made to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS), resulting in the removal of over 235,000 malicious websites.

SERS was launched by the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) and the City of London Police in April 2020 to enable the public to forward suspicious emails to an automated system that scans them for malicious links. Since its launch, almost 21 million reports have been made to the service.

Mobile phone providers also offer a service that allows customers to report suspicious text messages, by forwarding them to the number 7726. The service is free of charge and enables providers to takedown malicious websites and block malicious texts from being sent across their network.

As of 31 May 2023, 54,000 text message scams have been removed as a result of suspicious texts forwarded to the **7726** service

Commander Nik Adams, from City of London Police, said:

"Every year, thousands of people in the UK are scammed by a fraudulent email or text message. Phishing scams, whether it's a text message claiming you have missed a delivery and are required to pay a redelivery fee, or an email claiming to be from your bank are a common security challenges that both individuals and businesses across the UK face on a daily basis.

If you receive an email or text message that you think might be a scam, don't respond to it or click any links in the message or email. Instead, contact the organisation directly using contact information from the company's official website, and not the links or numbers provided in the message itself.

If you think you have been a victim of fraud, report it to Action Fraud at www.actionfraud. police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040. By reporting phishing scams or suspected fraud, you are directly helping us in our work to identify and stop these criminals and helping us protect others from these scams"

#### How to protect yourself from scam emails and texts

Received an email or text that seems suspicious? Report it. Your reports enable us to remove the emails and websites criminals use to commit fraud and cyber crime.

- 1. Forward suspicious emails to *report@phishing.gov.uk* . Send emails to this address that feel suspicious, even if you're not certain they're a scam we can check.
- 2. Forward suspicious text messages to 7726 (it's free of charge). Your provider can find out where the text came from and block or ban the sender.
- 3. If you've lost money or provided personal information as a result of a phishing scam, notify your bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040. In Scotland, call Police Scotland on 101.
