





Elkesley Parish Council Notes from meeting held on Tuesday 19 October 2021

Councillor J Skelton chaired the meeting. He reported that all councillors had been working behind the scenes during the month.

During the public session, a parishioner mentioned that motor cycles were being used regularly on the playing field. The Chairman told him to report the matter to the police on 101. If can be done safely, take photographs and make note of registration number.

It was also mentioned about the flyer to be given to new residents. This is to be passed onto all councillors for them to give out when necessary. It is also to be displayed in the notice boards.

The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed and signed as a correct record.

Financial details were given and the payments due were made.

Budget suggestions for 2022/23 were discussed. Looking into having a budget for HR services was mentioned and also a possible event to take place for the Queen's Platinum anniversary in June 2022 was a possibility.

General & financial risk assessments had been circulated and were agreed.

An outline planning application has been received for residential development on land to the north of The Barn, Twyford Lane. This is the land behind Starbucks. On the original neighbourhood planning regarding housing this area was stated as not being developed because of the access. Highways are now saying this is acceptable. A comment is to be made regarding the possible access problems which may occur.

The were no objections to the planning application for a single storey front extension with amendments to the garage roof at Rivet House, Brough Lane.

It was agreed that the sports field hedge will be trimmed back during the winter months. This is to be done by Nikki May with the help of Councillor May.

Clarification was made about the emptying of the bins around the village. BDC have confirmed that this will be done on a weekly basis.

The offer from Starbucks for use of the premises for holding meetings was discussed and after comments it was agreed not to take up the offer at present. They are to be thanked for the offer.

The sports field & play area inspections had been made. The plate on the Muga had been repaired and the screw on the gate replaced meetings.

Various other items of maintenance on the field were discussed.

- Signs need replacing.
- A post at the bottom of the field is rotten and also needs replacing.
- The bin at the barbecue still has to be placed.
- Three of the concrete bollards at the end of Lime Tree Road have been damaged. It was thought that these may have been put in by Highways. They are to be approached to see if they will replace them.
- Part of chain link fence between the playing field and the grass field is in need of repair.
- The mower requires new blades.
- The pavement from the Memorial Hall onto the field is cracking and requires attention.

All these things are to be looked at and if necessary, dealt with over the winter months.

Certain items are being left on the grave stones in the cemetery. This is not allowed.

An independent annual inspection for the BMX track has been received Most items are low or moderate risk.

The benches that were removed when the football field was turned around have still not been replaced. It was suggested that the councillors think where these may be re-sited and report at the next meeting.

The Remembrance Day poppies are to be displayed around the village as in the past.

Gamston with West Drayton and Eaton Parish Council Notes from the 14th October 2021 Meeting

1. Traffic Calming

With Government restrictions now being lifted the Council agreed to order several Speed Watch signs for use on key highways across the Parish in conjunction with the Parish Councils Speed Gun.

The Parish Council continues to make representations to Notts County Council Highways regarding clarification on the designs for the traffic calming measures NCC Highways are proposing to implement in **Eaton**.

2. Highways Matters

Following a request by the residents of **Eaton** for the Parish Council to investigate possible solutions to stop people jumping off the bridge at Eaton into the River Idle. The Senior Bridge Manager for Via East Midlands response has ruled out the installation of a fence being erected on the bridge. The Parish Council will continue to explore other options to assist the residents with addressing this concern.

Damage to the sign at the top of Muttonshire Hill, **Gamston** was brought to the attention of the Parish Council and an action noted to report this to NCC Highways.

Rockley dykes and water standing on Mill Lane continue to be on the Parish agenda. Highways are aware of the situation as is the district councillor, no further actions to note at present.

3. Defibrillators

The Parish Council have been asked by a resident of **Rockley** to look at the viability of adding to the current network of defibrillators throughout the Parish by having one in Rockley. Defibrillators can currently be found in Eaton & Gamston

4. Red Telephone Boxes

Unfortunately, damage has been caused to the phone box in **West Drayton**, someone has removed a significant number of panes of glass and the frames. The Parish Council would welcome suggestions from residents as to what they would like to see the old telephone box being used for please put these forward for consideration. Examples of alternative uses across other telephone boxes across the Parish include, a library, bug hotel, defibrillator.

Please send your suggestions to the Clerk for discussion at our November meeting.

5. Community Groups

Mr P Rider from the Eaton Village Independent Action Group (EVIAG) read a statement on behalf of the representatives of this group which outlined a number of areas that they would like to work with the Parish Council in addressing with their aim being 'to improve the life of residents and visitors in Eaton" An extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council was called for Wednesday 20th October 2021 to enable the council to discuss and respond to a number of matters raised within their email of 10th October 2021.

6. Planning

No objections were raised by the Parish Council to the planning application

7. Vacancies


